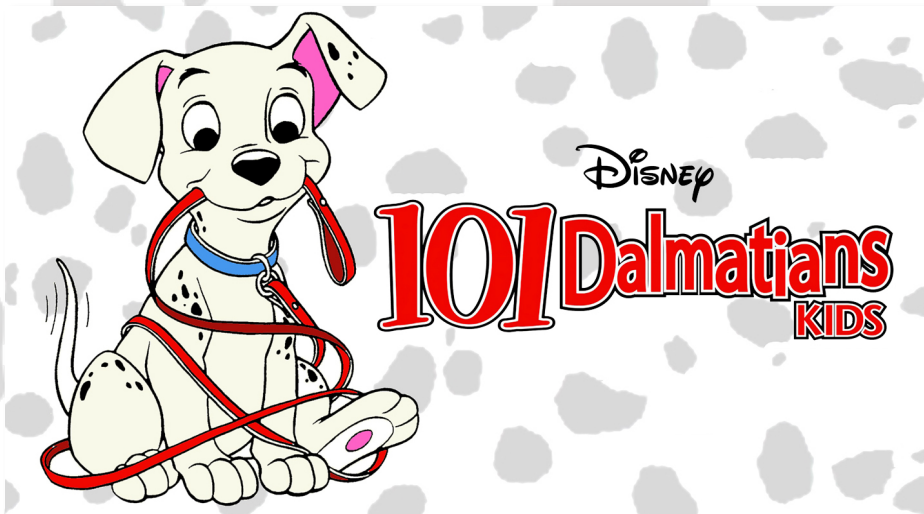


# 101 Dalmatians
